What is Occupational Health (OH)?

Occupational Health is a confidential support service designed to help teachers manage health-related issues that may affect their ability to work. It provides assessments, advice, and recommendations to ensure a safe and effective return to work or adjustments where necessary.

When Should You Consider OH Support?

- If you have been absent due to illness for an extended period (e.g., four weeks or more).
- If a recurring health issue is impacting your ability to work.
- If you require workplace adjustments due to a medical condition.
- As part of a phased return to work plan.
- If you are experiencing workplace stress or mental health concerns.

How Do You Access Occupational Health?

- 1. Referral by School/Employer:
 - Your principal or employer can refer you to OH with your consent.
 - A referral form is completed, outlining health concerns and their impact on work.
- 2. Self-Referral (if applicable):
 - Some schools allow teachers to self-refer; check with your employer or union representative.
- 3. OH Assessment:
 - A consultation is arranged with an OH professional.
 - They assess your health in relation to your teaching duties.
- 4. Recommendations & Support:
 - OH may suggest adjustments, phased returns, or further medical support.
 - A report is sent to your employer with recommendations.
- 5. Implementation & Follow-Up:
 - Adjustments are put in place as agreed.
 - Follow-up assessments may be scheduled to review progress.

What Does OH Mean for You?

- Confidential and independent support—your health information remains private.
- Tailored recommendations to meet your health and work needs.
- Assistance in returning to work safely after illness or injury.
- Guidance on workplace adjustments to help you thrive in your role.
